

Marrs lose 1st contest

CHARLOTTETOWN (CP) — Charlottetown Islanders overpowered Thunder Bay Marrs 8-3 Sunday in the brawl-filled opening game of their Eastern Centennial Cup junior hockey semi-final.

Second game of the best-of-seven series will be played here today with the third, fourth and fifth games in Thunder Bay later this week.

Referee Joe MacInnis called 31 penalties including seven game misconducts, three misconducts, 13 majors and eight minors.

The Islanders took a 2-0 lead in the opening period and scored three unanswered goals on regular Marr goaltender Dave Lysak in the second.

The count went to 7-0 early in the third with Marrs' substitute Ken Turcot in the nets.

Neil MacDonald and Nelson Pyatt scored for Thunder Bay before the Islanders got their eighth goal. Bill MacDonald got the third Thunder Bay goal with five minutes and eight seconds remaining.

Rightwinger Don Jones set the pace for Charlottetown with three goals. Bob MacGuigan added two while single goals went to Don Brown, Kevin Devine and Angus Beck.
