FORTS HOCKEY HEAD RETIRES

Bob Armstrong Relinquishes Post as President of Fort William Club

FORT WILLIAM, Ont., April 19—After three years' of admirable service as president of the Fort William Senior Hockey club, Western Canada champions, and runners-up for the Allan cup this year, Bob Armstrong last night relinquished the post in face of a strong voice for his reelection. Bob Judge succeeded him.

Other officers elected were: Eli Sutcliffe, vice-president; Jim Speers and D. G. Calvert, executive members, and W. F. Rankin, secretary-treasurer.

It was with the deepest of regrets that the meeting heard the decision of President Armstrong to definitely retire from the field. In his years of office, the former centre forward dash, exercised the same clean and upright measures that marked him as one of the straightest and finest products of amateur hockey in Western Canada. While the club deeply regrets his loss, it is generally felt that his successor, who is perhaps one of Fort William's most ardent enthusiasts of the game, will fill his shoes to a nicety.
