

# Fort William Enters Allan Cup Finals, Beating Trail

**Forts Win Second Game 4 to 1 to Win Round by Five Goals—Victors Superior in Every Department, But Are Forced to Battle Hard All the Way—Pettinger Suffers Broken Wrist and Will Be Out of Finals.**

Vancouver, B.C., March 21. — Fort William emerged victorious in the semi-final round of the Allan cup series defeating Trail, British Columbia champions, 4 to 1, here tonight, and winning the round 8 to 3. The Forts will engage Toronto Varsity Grads in the first game of the final series here Friday night.

The winners were superior in nearly every department of the game but had to battle all the way through. Play tonight was marked by hard checking and several injuries. Pettinger, Forts centre, was put out of action in the first period. He sustained a broken wrist bone and will be prevented from playing in the final series. Reddick, Trail defense-man, was knocked out in the second period. The Forts scored one in the first and second periods, and twice in the third, while Trail's counter came half way in the final period.

#### First Period

Going into the contest with a two-goal lead the Fort William team played a strong defensive game, their forwards back-checking and skating back fast. They scored one goal through Cook in six minutes, after he had drawn the Trail goalie out of the net. The Forts played more finished hockey, Trail combination being lacking at the crucial time. They sent in a number of shots however, which brought the Forts' net winder to his knees. The Forts had a distinct edge on the play.

#### Second Period

The second period was productive of very scrappy and indifferent hockey. Fort William scored the only goal when Davis beat Jackson clean on a high shot just as the session ended. Checking was very hard and Reddick was laid out by a blow from a stick and carried off the ice.

Four penalties were handed out but

Referee Genge was booed and hooted, papers were thrown on the ice and a general uproar ensued. The Trail goalie saved his team on many occasions by wonderful net minding.

#### Third Period

The Forts continued their scoring in the last period, getting two counters while Trail's only counter came from Kendall on a combination play.

Ward and Cook were stars, each sagging the net and causing Jackson to display his best wares in keeping the count down. Near the end Trail livened up but the Forts' defense and stiff back-checking held them at bay, their score being batted in after Lauriente and Wheatley had shot. Both teams missed several chances to score with open net. Only two penalties were handed out, both to Wheatley of Trail.
