

# FORTS SCORE 11-6 WIN OVER WEYBURN IN FINAL CONTEST

## Thunder Bay Champions Enjoy Light Workout Before Leaving For Vancouver to Meet Trail

Regina, Sask., March 14. — The Fort William hockey team will leave tomorrow for Vancouver, there to take on the British Columbia-Alberta winners in the Allan cup semi-finals. Before leaving Regina the Forts enjoyed a nice light workout at the Stadium rink tonight, taking on the Weyburn Beavers for their practice. When the three periods were completed Forts had piled up a count of 11-6, thereby making their total for the two-game series, 20-7.

Had the Forts stepped out tonight they might have doubled the count, but with a margin of eight goals to start out with and with five more packed away to the Weyburn team's one at the end of the first period, hockey was tossed to the skies and the Boys proceeded to take things easy from then on. The less said about it as an Allan cup play-down the better.

At no time during the game did the Forts uncover their real form, and at no time did the Weyburn team look like reducing the lead.

Ward was the big scorer ace for the Forts. He potted the rubber five times and assisted in another. Hacquoil got a brace and Pettinger, Cook, Fraser and McLeod one each.
